### SPECIAL AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

In addition to badges of rank and merit badges, Scouts are eligible to earn a number of other awards that reflect their achievements. **The requirements for these awards are listed in the current *Boy Scout Requirements* book No. 33215, and on the specific application forms.** A brief synopsis only of each award follows.

#### Mile Swim, BSA

Train for and complete a swim covering a full mile. (Swim trunks emblem only.)

#### BSA Lifeguard

Practice in boat rescues, and advanced rescue skills.

#### Snorkeling, BSA

Achieve basic proficiency in snorkeling.

#### Boardsailing, BSA

Achieve basic proficiency in boardsailing.

#### Historic Trails Award

Plan and participate in a historic activity as a group.

#### 50-Miler Award

Take part in a wilderness trip covering at least 50 consecutive miles over at least 5 days and do service.

#### Firem'n Chit

Demonstrate campfire and fire handling skills.

#### Totin' Chip

Demonstrate you know how to handle woods tools.

#### Paul Bunyan Woodsman

Extension of Totin' Chip award. (Trail pack or blanket.)

#### Leave No Trace

Important outdoor ethics awareness.

#### World Conservation Award

Earn a required set of merit badges to earn this award.

#### Interpreter Strip

Show knowledge of a foreign language or the sign language for the hearing impaired. (Insignia worn centered above "Boy Scouts of America" strip on uniform by adults or Scouts.)

#### Hornaday Awards

William T. Hornaday was a pioneer of conservation in our nation's history. Award given to unit, Scout or adult to recognize exceptional service in conservation.

#### National Court of Honor Lifesaving and Meritorious Awards

The National Court of Honor presents awards for rare Scoutlike action and for saving life.

#### Den Chief Service Award

Den chiefs who complete certain service and training requirements can receive this special recognition.

#### Religious Emblem

"A Scout is Reverent." Show your faith by doing your duty to God. Each faith has different requirements.
